NHS Introducing the 'Dead Patients Club' film; Education A supplementary resource for Scotland



This short film is of an experienced clinical leader (Dr Ken Donaldson, Medical Director for an NHS) Health Board) sharing some reflections on his clinical career; in particular remembering some of the patients that had died. As healthcare professionals we may be affected by the death of someone who we are close to, but we can also be impacted by the death of a patient. The film is to remind us all that it can be very real and long lasting. Dr Donaldson came to this realisation through a conversation with a person who was bereaved. It led him to also consider whether a particular patient death influenced his future career path.
